Explanation of Grading System

Unit of Credit: The unit of credit is the semester hour. A semester hour of credit represents course work involving one 50-minute classroom hour per week over a period of 14 to 16 weeks plus an examination in the work of the course, or course work making equivalent demands upon the student.

Credits Required for LL.B. Degree:

For students entering the School prior to September, 1960, a total of 87 semester hours of credit in work taken over a period of three academic years (six semesters) was required in order to earn the degree of Bachelor of Laws.

For students entering the School September, 1960, or later, 88 hours of credit are required.

Requirements for the J.D. Degree:

Satisfactory completion of all credit hours required as in the case of the LL.B. Degree, plus a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university.

Grades are assigned on a numerical scale of 0-100. Since September, 1968, they have had the following descriptive equivalents: Distinguished 90-100, Excellent 85-89, Good 75-84, Qualified 70-74, Unsatisfactory below 70. From September 1956, through June, 1968, grades had the following descriptive equivalents: Distinguished 85-100, Good 80-84, Fair 75-79, Passing 70-74, Unsatisfactory below 70. A limited number of courses may be taken on a Pass/Fail basis. Successful completion of such courses is indicated by the letter P.

Averages: A student's average for any period of time is determined by multiplying the grade received in each course taken during the period by the number of semester hours of credit the course carries, then dividing the sum of these products by the total number of semester hours of work taken during the period.

Requirements for Earning of Credits:

Since September, 1956:

1. An average of 70 or better has been required for the work of each year;
2. Grades in Accounting have not been included in computing students' averages. (Academic credit has been given for work in Accounting in which a grade of 70 or better has been received.)

Beginning with the 1959-60 academic year:

1. There has been added to the requirement of an average of 70 in the work of each year, a requirement that the student receive in each year grades of 70 or better in at least two-thirds of the total number of semester hours of work taken during the year.
2. The courses in Accounting have been excluded from computations to determine compliance with the above requirement, as well as from computations of averages.

Waiver of Modification of the academic requirements in individual cases rests in the discretion of the faculty of the School.
